**Social Studies** - Who were the early explorers of the Pacific Northwest? Why were they looking at the land here? Did they stick around, build any forts, or move on? How did they get here, by land or by sea? These are some of the questions we are looking at in our newest chapter of Washington History.

### 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade News

This week's featured class is Math. We have three math classes available to 5th and 6th grade students this year: 5th grade, 6th grade, and 7th grade. There is a lot of overlap from 5th grade to 6th grade, which allows a good opportunity for students to advance a level if they are ready. Advancing a student is a decision that is made together with Mr. Biebert as the 7th grade math teacher and the parents of the student, and is based on daily work habits, report card grades, and MAP testing scores. Our math curriculum is organized by skill, with each chapter building upon the previous chapter's skills. My math class time is separated into about 10 minutes to work on math fact practice with the XtraMath program, about 15-20 minutes for the new lesson, and about another 45 minutes to work on practice and homework. Ideally, students should never be bringing math homework home if everything during class goes according to plan. On Fridays, I combine the 5th and 6th grade classes to teach a geometry lesson. Those skills have typically been located in the last chapters of the book, and so we haven't always gotten to them. Combining the classes on Friday gives students more time to finish work and a more balanced math experience.

In other classes, we are coming up on the first parable that Jesus told in religion class. Students will be keeping a "parable journal" to analyze the meaning of the different lessons Jesus taught. In social studies, we just started learning about Julius Caesar and Caesar Augustus's roles in starting the Roman Empire. In Science class, we are saying goodbye to our goldfish guests this week as we come to the end of our ecosystem study. Finally, in English students will be demonstrating their understanding of grammar this week and next with a pair of assessments on sentence parts and nouns.

**IMPORTANT READING NOTE!** Please send your child to school with interesting reading materials. Mrs. Schultz is going to have a couple of days next week when they will choose their own book to read-to-self instead of the class novel.

Finally, I am emphasizing working on XtraMath during free time in the classroom. If you haven't seen the program, it's basically flash cards on the computer. It's really important that students are getting their math facts memorized before they get to Mr. Biebert's math classes. There is plenty of time during the school day to get this practice done, but please have a conversation with your student about whether they are making use of that time. It will make math easier for them (and you!) down the road.

### 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade News

Well, I am glad we got our field trip in this last week, because it seems as though fall weather is here to stay. You will get lots of opportunity to enjoy it with the teacher's conference/short week next week.

Here is the memory work for next week:

10/16: Ephesians 2:8,9, 1 John 2:2, 2nd Article up to "suffering and death"

This week your children got to practice expressing a thought in the trade language, Chinook Jargon. This was a language of around 300 words. You can probably how difficult it would be to express emotion and ideas with such few words. Unfortunately many treaties were translated into this language, which often led to misunderstanding and unfair treaties being accepted between Europeans and Native Americans.

We ate Twizzlers for science this week. It was mainly because I love twizzler pull n peel, but also it was slightly because they serve as a great representation of striated skeletal muscles. We labeled the parts of our striated muscles and discussed their uses. Fast twitch and slow twitch muscles also jumped into the mix as we identified what these different types of muscles are used for.

Please remember that we do only have a two day week planned for next week as the teachers are traveling for teacher's conference. I am so so excited to sit in class for 7 hours over multiple days.....yippee! It is always great to get the student perspective again.
