After a five-day break, we are ready to get back into the swing of preschool, again. We are now covering a new theme – Pets. We first decided, as a class, what makes an animal a pet. School just keeps churning along as we are coming up to the end of the 3rd quarter. We've got the usual end-of-quarter events coming up this week and next, which I'll give some specifics about.

In Religion, we have been doing an "Across the Gospels" study of Holy Week, learning the accounts of the main events from the different perspectives of the Gospel writers. This week we looked at the events in the Garden of Gethsemane and Peter's betrayal. In math class, the 5th grade has continued their work with multiplying and dividing with decimal numbers, while the 6th grade has started a study of ratios. In science, students completed their rubber band cannon lab, and will be moving on to a catapult investigation. I apologize for any spontaneous catapults that manifest themselves at your homes. In social studies, we finished up our study of life in the Colonies, and will be taking a test on those lessons, followed by an investigation into the Salem Witch Trials. Finally, in English, our last day working on essays was Wednesday. I am giving students until Friday to get their work turned in, and will be correcting or marking things late on Saturday.

This week marks our last week of spelling class. There will not be a spelling grade on the report card in the 4th quarter. I will be using that time to offer students more opportunity to get their Xtra Math practice done on the computer, and then to work on their keyboarding skills with their Typing.com accounts. Students who have not finished their XtraMath practice by the time lunch recess comes each day will be required to stay inside for study hall to work on that practice.

We are very happy to have Mrs. Benson back in our room this week, and look forward to seeing her pictures and hearing her stories about Washington D.C. as our group anticipates being the next to enjoy that field trip in two years.
