5th-6th Grade News

Welcome to the fourth quarter! I hope all the families had a nice break and you were able to get all the adventure or relaxation or whatever it was you were looking for. It's my favorite break of the year because of all the wonderful opportunities to worship and reflect on Christ's love for us.

In the classroom, we are rolling along with our curriculum and doing a pretty good job of staying on track. In religion classes, we are studying the events around Jesus' resurrection as well as the 5th Petition of the Lord's Prayer. In math, the 5th grade is coming to the end of their unit on dividing decimals and will have a test on Monday. Meanwhile, the 6th grade class is continuing their study of ratios and proportions, especially practicing writing and using proportions from word problems. In science class, we continue our study of energy transformations, this week with a focus on drawing effective diagrams. In social studies, we have reached the years leading up to the American Revolution. After studying this chapter, we will have an investigation into the virtues of the revolution, followed by a structured academic controversy, and our final essay of the year. This will be the last major writing project, but it won't come up for a few weeks yet. Finally, as we build the background knowledge for that essay, we are finishing up the parts of speech we haven't studied yet in English: prepositions, conjunctions, and interjections.

So far, our substitution of XtraMath for Spelling (hooray we finished the curriculum!) has yielded good results, with students getting their highest cumulative class scores of the year. They earned two prizes right before break, the first being a game day in class which we are doing today, and the second to-be-determined based on what I can finagle. I will continue raising the goal and we will see how much we are able to accomplish before the end of the year.

The disciples were in hiding. Their teacher had been arrested and executed, and they had acted shamefully. They abandoned Jesus when they should have helped him. Now, he was dead, and they couldn't apologize or make it up to him. The guilt they felt must have been astronomical.

Worse than that, though, was the fact that the people who killed Jesus were probably going to arrest and kill them, too. So they locked themselves in a room and waited for the inevitable.

They were not, however, visited by the vindictive Jewish leaders. Instead, they were visited by Jesus. He who had been crucified, dead, and buried was now very much alive and standing among them. He entered without using the door. The surprise they felt must have been astronomical.
