5th-6th Grade News

This week's highlighted class is our religion class. We split the religion time slot into two topics: Bible history (which we call Christ Light) and Bible application (which we call Faith Foundations). This year we are studying the New Testament in Christ Light. In addition to focusing on the culmination of God's plan for our salvation, we are going to be paying special attention to the miracles Jesus and his Apostles performed, as well as the parable Jesus told. That focus will lead us to some new study strategies during class time, and those aspects of Jesus' ministry will be a regular feature on assessments. Last year during Faith Foundations we studied the Ten Commandments. This year we are going to be studying the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer. The assessments for Faith Foundations will regularly ask the students to answer questions based on the lessons about those two key parts of doctrine, and then ask the students to support their answers with examples from the Bible.

We just finished our first assessments in both Christ Light and Faith Foundations this week.

In math class, we also finished our first tests on Tuesday. All graded papers should be brought home by students (not hoarded in desks or thrown away in the classroom) so please ask your students if you can see how they did. Remember that all assignments with a letter grade (A-B-C-D-F and E-S-N-U) can be redone for a better grade. The next chapters in math will take both classes into studying multiplication and division.

In science, we are coming to the end of our study on energy and waves. Our next unit on ecosystems will begin next week, highlighting our field trip to Koi Gardens as a practical lesson in why ecosystems are important. In social studies, we are also coming to the end of our unit about Ancient Greece. There will be a test next week at the end of the unit, and then a deeper dive into one of the topics mentioned during the unit: Athenian Democracy. We wrapped up our practice essays this week in English and will be switching our focus to grammar over the next few weeks.

I have already received back many of the field trip permission forms that were sent home. Thank you for being so prompt in returning those! If you still have yours, please get it back to me soon so I can make arrangements for transportation.

School picture envelopes were also sent home. Please ask your children about them if you have not received the envelopes yet.

In addition to a field trip next week, it is also our first week of MAP testing. MAP testing is an online standardized testing format that helps us establish a baseline for the school year about where students are individually in their learning. We will take this test two more times during the school year to track growth across math, English, and reading. Our class will be testing on Monday afternoon, Tuesday afternoon, and Thursday morning. Please make sure students are being well-fed and well-rested that week so they are in an ideal condition to do their best!

7th-8th Grade News

Well, I feel like the most privileged teacher in the world. Thank you to my students and many of you who went out of your way to spoil me on my birthday this week. It was all very undeserved, but very much appreciated.

Here is the memory work for next week:

9/18: Psalm 37:5, Psalm 50:15, Romans 8:28; 9/20: Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer; 9/21: Review Peace In Christ; 9/22: 1 Peter 5:7, The First Article of the Apostles' Creed

The students presented their region reports this week, and then quizzed their classmates on the material that they presented. The reports were fabulous, we had a puppet show, slide presentations, poster board presentations, we had it all!! We used this presentation to also talk more about creating a bibliography properly. Overall, I think a lot of learning objectives were accomplished through this assignment.

The students took their tests on skin this week. We then started our next unit on more systems. The first one that we will look at is the skeletal system.

Overall, I have been pretty impressed by the work ethic that I am seeing in math class so far. Students are not necessarily getting everything correct, but I am seeing a lot of desire to fix up mistakes when necessary. Please continue to encourage your children to drill math facts, and please support the needed work ethic to be successful with their math skill development.

8th graders parents: Pastor West will be reaching out to all of you in the next few weeks to discuss confirmation class in regards to the Lutheran practice of confirmation. He will fill you in on specifics at your meeting.

D.C. Meeting Alert: There will be a D.C. trip meeting right after school on this upcoming Monday.

Please remember that MAP testing is next week. Please help your children to get as much sleep and a 5 course breakfast so that they can be as successful as possible with their tests.
