A dad and his young son had busy schedules, but Saturday was their day together. With rare exceptions, the day always started the same way—dad and son would get matching bowls and fill them with identical cereal, and dad would say, "Same?" and the son would echo, "Same." After breakfast. it was time to get dressed, and both dad and son put on a pair of blue jeans and a faded red shirt and the dad would say, "Same?" and the son would say, "Same." For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin—because anyone who has died has been set free from sin.

Romans 6:5-7
