Word of God - This week we have been learning how Jesus teaches he is the Savior first to Nicodemus that the Holy Spirit brings people to faith and that through faith they receive eternal life. Reading - What would it be like to immigrate to the US in the early 1900s? We are exploring this and many other concepts through our new novel, "In the Year of the Boar and Jackie Robinson."

5th-6th Grade News

Our featured class for this week is English. I alternate my English lessons between writing units and grammar units. The grammar units are a combination of 5th and 6th grade textbooks, going through the 8 parts of speech, parts of sentences, and punctuation. The writing units are tied into other subjects like social studies, science, and reading. That way we can use the background knowledge that has already been built for the basis of our writing projects. I plan to have four major writing projects this year: an opinion essay, an informative essay, a narrative, and an argument essay. Depending on how things go, I also hope to teach a poetry unit later in the year. My goal is that by the time students graduate 6th grade, they are able to write an essay independently in as short a time as a day or two.

In other classes, we are learning about some of the miracles Jesus did early in his ministry during religion class. Both math classes have completed the chapter 2 test and moved on to division lessons. In science, we have finished our ecosystems projects (they are really cool and you should come into the classroom to take a look!) and are observing them as we learn more about how ecosystems interact with each other. In social studies we have started our study of ancient Rome, and in English we are learning about nouns.

Finally, thank you to everyone who brought in bottles for our ecosystem project. They turned out very cool, and we would love to show you what they're like if you want to come into the classroom!

7th-8th Grade News

This week saw the 7-8th grade doing a few things out of the norm. We had Mr. Jeff Hohenthal come and talk to the kids about making concrete. This was in connection with our big question in science of: How is the structure of our bones similar to concrete. The kids not only got to learn a life skill, but got to connect it with science. This was also perfect timing, because we went to Grand Coulee Dam this week as well. Did you know that Grand Coulee Dam took 12 million cubic yards of concrete?.....I ain't hand mixing that much concrete. Anyway, thank you to Mr. Hohenthal for sharing his expertise with us, and thank you for allowing your children to attend the field trip. It was a fun week!

Here is the memory work for next week:

10/9: Psalm 51:5, Isaiah 53:6, 2nd Article up to "living and the dead"; 10/12: Hymn 378: 1,4,5; 10/13: Romans 3:24, 2 Corinthians 5:21, 2nd Article up to "is my Lord"

This week we started looking at the coastal tribes and plateau tribes of Washington. We discussed how these are real cultures and real tribes who had differences like where they lived, what they ate, what traditions they had, what they wore, and many many more. This shouldn't be surprising to us, but I think sometimes we mentally group Native Americans into one pot thinking they were all the same. Next week we will begin to see how Europeans influenced these various cultures.

We began our study of muscles this week, and we connected how muscles tie into bones as well. Do you know which takes more muscles, smiling or frowning? Do you know what some different types of muscles are? Ask your child these questions, and if they give you a blank stare, then feel free to come and give me the stink eye, or offer up some other passive aggressive insult that shows your disapproval.

Wouldn't it be great to live a life filled with the virtues in today's Bible passage? Then you could effortlessly display patience with your coworkers, selflessness in your marriage, and compassion in your parenting. It would make all those sorts of interpersonal relationships better if you had this kind of mindset.

This attitude, however, is hard to come by. The temptation toward selfish ambition and vain conceit is constant. Human nature is selfish by default. We are all born with the sinful tendency to serve ourselves rather than others and to view our way as the only right way. That, coupled with a culture that encourages you to focus exclusively on yourself, makes the virtues in this passage seem unattainable.

So the question of the day is this: Can you really live a life filled with those virtues, or is that wishful thinking? The answer is yes when you are united to Christ. When you become a Christian, Jesus changes you from dead in sin to alive in faith. Because Jesus lived for you, died for you, and rose from the dead for you, God sees you as a child he loves—a child with the

amazing ability to love like Jesus loves you.

God does not see you as some hopeless, lost cause of a sinner. You are forgiven, and that totally changes the way you look at others. You don't have to be selfish, angry, or lose control anymore. Be united with Christ.

Prayer:

Holy Spirit, unite me to Christ and give me humility so that I value others above myself. Amen.
