# 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade News

We have just a little bit over a month of classes left in the year! I'm trying to keep the learning activities fresh so the kids don't get bored and slide into the end of the year. Keep an eye out for that lazy slump at home and if the adults can keep encouraging (or prodding) the students along, we should be able to finish the year strongly.

Toward that goal of a strong finish, we are watching a video this week called <u>The Road to Emmaus</u>. Part of the discussion is how well it represents the Biblical account from <u>Luke 24</u>, and part of it is when we could share this video with someone else in our own lives. Please feel free to check those out and have a similar discussion with your child!

In other classes, the 5th grade math students are learning about area with square units, while the 6th grade math students are finishing their chapter on how fractions, decimals, and percentages are related. In science class, we are learning about heat transfer and how to speed up and slow down that process. In social studies, we have begun our study of original documents from the American Revolution as part of our structured academic controversy to help us determine whether the American Revolution was virtuous or not. Finally, in English class we have completed our study of the parts of speech and have begun to practice with proper punctuation.

Last of all, some of our students have decided to participate in a class skit for the talent show. This will not count as an individual performance, so students can still sign up to demonstrate their own talent if they'd like. As of right now, 14 of the students are going to perform a song parody with their teacher about being ready for summer break.

# 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade News

Let the bocce begin! This week we started our annual bocce ball tournament, which means that spring and the fourth quarter are well underway. We really only have about a month left in the school year, and it is going to go fast.

Monday 4/29: Psalm 31:15a, Psalm 90:12, Proverbs 6:6; Wednesday 5/1: 1 Corinthians 10:31, Galatians 5:13b; Thursday 5/2: Hymn 391:1,4-6; Friday 5/3: Deuteronomy 8:17,18, Psalm 24:1, Luke 16:13

History class this week has focused on two different aspects, but really, they both go hand in hand. We identified all the different countries and cultures that heavily influenced the PNW, and we also identified how this influence led to the growth of 4 major cities in the area: Tacoma, Seattle, Portland, and Spokane. We are currently looking at the period from 1880-1910 and seeing how much changed in the PNW during this period. The population, for an example, rose from 75,000 in 1880 to 1.2 million in 1910 in Washington State alone. You'll have to tune in next week to learn.....the rest of the story. (Little Paul Harvey shout out for you)

We began a new unit this week on genetics and mutations in science. Along with this study, we started out by looking at traits and the different variations that we see in traits. The students may be asking you some questions as well in connection with traits, so if you get asked.....sorry!

We sing this Sunday in the 10:00 service. I appreciate you taking the time to have your students come for the service so that they can participate with their class in singing.

We found out this last weekend that Mr. Zabel has accepted the call to come and serve at St. Matthew. I look forward to working with him to determine teaching duties between the two of us moving forward.

# The Good Shepherd Knows

A fan can know a lot about a celebrity on a superficial level. They can know the celebrity's birthday, life story, and so many other details. However, if they were to bump into each other in public, the celebrity would know nothing about the fan. It's a one-sided, superficial relationship at best.

Have you ever thought of your relationship with Jesus in the same way— "I know a lot about him. but does he really know me?" Or maybe you are searching the Bible to learn more about God and what he's like, but does he really know you? It's actually the other way around. Jesus, your Good Shepherd, knows you.
