Questions- I'm sure these first few days of school have taken some adjusting. 4th Grade News

Welcome and Welcome back! It is so great to be back in the classroom and see everyone each day! Thank you for the opportunity to teach your child each day!

Word of God - This week we have been learning about the joy our Savior's birth brings to us. We have been discussing ways we show that joy in our lives. Our song for the week, "Peace in Christ" is the song we will be singing with the whole school when we sing in church on September 24 @10:00.

Memory Work - Please see the calendar sent home today.

Math - We have been working on reviewing in math class to assess what we know and remember from 3rd grade. It has been a fun time. We will be taking a pretest to begin each chapter in math and assess where your child is at currently. These are not graded.

Social Studies - The focus is the geography of Washington state and how geography shapes the way we live?

Science - We are focusing on the main essential question: How does Earth's water effect weather?

Reading - Character traits and setting, two very important parts of books, are the focus this week in our book, <u>Sadako and the</u> <u>Thousand Paper Cranes</u>.

English/Writing - Reviewing the parts of speech is the focus for the first two weeks of school. We have also already written our first poem of the year! Come check them out on the 4th grade feature month board, downstairs in the basement of the church on Sunday, September 24th when we sing in church.

Spelling/Vocabulary: This week's focus is the Greek root: Hydr- and the Latin roots: aqua-, mer- & mar-. What do these roots have in common? They all mean water! Our first test was today over our Greek & Latin roots words.

EXTRA NOTES:

- I have handed out a memory work calendar to your child with the due dates for the month of September. I also gave them an extra in their mailbox for at home. Please check and empty the graded papers zippered pouch/envelope, and return on Friday or Monday.
- If your child has not yet returned the Learning Contract, please return it as soon as possible. If you need a new one, please write me a note in your child's assignment notebook.
- Your child should be bringing home their binder and assignment notebook/planner each night. Please check the assignment notebook/planner to see what homework needs to be completed and initial that work was finished. Any homework to be completed should be found in the homework envelope in the front of their binder. Please put completed homework back into the homework envelope to be returned to school and handed in. All of this helps with accountability in the classroom and at home. 5th-6th Grade News

We are off to a great first week of school! We have been mixing in establishing our routine with starting our classes, and should be up to full speed by this time next week.

One item I've noticed missing among some students' school supplies so far is a Bible. Please make sure your child has a Bible at school, we use it at least twice a day.

I like to give a quick update to what we are working on in each of our classes each week. In religion classes, we are just starting our study of the New Testament with the announcements and births of Jesus and John. We are also beginning our study of the Apostles' Creed. In math class, students are learning about place value, exponents, and expanded form. In science, we have been using springs and slinkies to learn about waves and energy. In social studies we are practicing how to evaluate different sources like photographs and autobiographies before we dive into our unit on ancient Greece. Finally, in English we are writing a "practice" essay so that students know the routine and what I expect from their writing when our first "real" essay comes later in the quarter.

Finally, I have our first field trip penciled in for the morning of September 22nd. If you would like to chaperone for any field trips this year, (including this one) please make sure you have a current background check on file with the office as well as a copy of your valid driver's insurance.

It has been so much fun to get back into the swing of things at school, and to get to interact with all my students again. I have enjoyed getting to have many of the 7th graders that I taught when they were in 5th grade back in my classroom as well. It has made for a relatively easy transition into the new school year. However, if you have any questions about anything, please feel free to reach out and I would be happy to assist. Please make sure your children are looking in their assignment notebooks every night as a way to get in a good work habit routine.

Here is the memory work for next week:

9/7: Peace in Christ(Song we sing for Sunday 9/24); 9/8: Romans 1:20, 1st Article up to "all evil";

I have been having a blast in our Washington State history class this year. We have been discussing the essential question: "How does Washington's geography and geology affect the way we live?" We have already identified that geography and geology affect the culture of our state. If you are wondering how in the world this is possible, feel free to ask your kids.....they better give you a well-constructed answer.

It also would seem that from our initial history class periods that there are many things that students have not experienced in our state. If you have other things that you think would be cool for our students to see in Washington State, and would like to help coordinate some sort of field trip with me, then I would love your help. As of right now, I have learned that many students have not seen the Palouse Falls, and many students have no experience of the Columbia River area. A beach day/sight-seeing

day may be in order to give the students this background knowledge of some of the sights and sounds of their state.

We also have gotten the ball rolling on learning about our skin. This is picking up where we left off from last year. So far we have discovered how sensitive different areas of our skin are, and now we have started digging into how we can protect our skin from skin cancer. The students are creating an experiment to test how well different spfs, brands, and types of sunscreens work.

Please don't forget that there is no school on Monday. I hope you and your family enjoy the long weekend. We will see you back at school on Tuesday.

Jesus is Lord

We live in a time when people are taught to speak up boldly for what they believe in. Whether it agrees with others or not, as long as it doesn't hurt anyone else, be proud of who you are and what you think. Find your voice and let it be heard.

In today's Bible verse, a pastor named Paul encourages his readers to speak boldly about the things they believe. But did you notice what he wants them to confess? He tells them to declare, "Jesus is Lord." Maybe that doesn't strike you as strange. "Jesus" and "Lord" are two words that are often associated with each other.

But "Lord" is a term that often refers to authority. It's a word for a master or owner—one who is in charge and in control. So, when we declare, "Jesus is Lord," we are saying that we are not. Jesus is above us and has authority over us. Who boldly confesses that they are under someone else?

When the Lord we are talking about is Jesus, we do. The word "Lord" in the Bible doesn't just describe someone who is in charge, someone who has all authority in heaven and earth. It describes a God who makes and keeps promises, who loves faithfully, dependably, and unconditionally. It describes a God who owns us because he was willing to give everything—even his own innocent life and priceless blood—to buy us out of slavery to sin and death. A God who showed the world a proof of purchase when he rose from the dead.

When, by God's power and grace, we confess, "Jesus is Lord," we aren't just saying that Jesus is in charge of our lives. We are confessing our humble trust in him, who loves us completely. We are rejoicing in his perfect love that paid the price required to forgive us and make us his own. And we are celebrating his rule over all things in heaven and earth to give us an eternal home in his presence.

Jesus, you paid an amazing price to make me your own. Help me confess you as Lord all the days of my life. Amen.
