**Word of God** - This week we have been learning about the Savior and how he was worshiped by the wise men and what we can learn from them and apply to our lives. Our song for the week, "Peace in Christ" is the song we will be singing with the whole school when we sing in church on September 24 @10:00.

**Memory Work -** The books of the Old Testament are coming up next week. We are working on them in class also, but extra practice is beneficial.

**Math** - We have been working on place value. The pretest for this chapter was sent home today. Please look it over as it will show you what areas are potentially needing extra practice with your child.

Social Studies - The focus is the geography of Washington state and how geography shapes the way we live?

Science - We are focusing on the main essential question: How does Earth's water affect weather?

**Reading** - Mood and perspective, two very important parts of books, are the focus this week in our book, <u>Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes</u>. We are wrapping up our book this week and focusing on our essential question, "What lessons about life can we learn from literature?

**English/Writing** - Reviewing the parts of speech is the focus for the first two weeks of school. We have also already written our first poem of the year! Come check them out on the 4th grade feature month board, downstairs in the basement of the church on Sunday, September 24th when we sing in church. We are working on descriptive writing this week and the beginning of next week.

**Spelling/Vocabulary**: Due to the short week, no spelling/vocabulary this week.

#### **EXTRA NOTES:**

- September is the fourth grade feature month. Something new we are doing this year. Special projects we have been working on will be on display in the church's basement. Also, we are helping to serve during coffee hour on Sunday, September 24 (the same Sunday we sing). More information will be sent home in a special note.
- If your child has not yet returned the Learning Contract, please return it as soon as possible. If you need a new one, please write me a note in your child's assignment notebook.
- Your child should be bringing home their binder and assignment notebook/planner every night. ## 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade News

We are fully up-to-speed this week, with all the pieces of our curriculum implemented into our daily routine. Over the next several weeks I am going to go a little more in-depth into one of our classes, to give you a better idea of what's happening in class.

This week I'm highlighting Memory Work. Each week, students will have a variety of Bible passages to choose from. We take the time on Thursday afternoons to look at all of the passages, and make a choice about which ones they will memorize. My hope is that they are picking passages that will challenge them in their memorization skill, that will broaden their knowledge of God's Word, and that have personal meaning to them. There is also a piece of the catechism that students will learn every week. Students can recite passages any time from Thursday to Thursday, or choose to write out their memory work on Thursday morning after school starts. Next week students will have TWO parts of the catechism on their schedule, so be sure to start studying those right away.

Onto the other classes! In religion we are learning about the early life of Jesus, as well as wrapping up what we believe about God the Father. In math, we are getting ready for our first tests, which will be next week Tuesday. In science, we are studying the characteristic properties of waves, and just starting to explore how sound and light waves are used. In social studies, we have begun our study of the ancient Greek civilization. Finally, in English we have started drafting the rough drafts of our practice essays. (No spelling this week because of a short week.)

I am looking for chaperones for our first field trip coming up on Friday, September 22nd. We will be going to Koi Gardens Pond Specialists to learn about ecosystems. Please make sure if you want to volunteer for any events at school this year that you have contacted Mr. Biebert to make sure you have an up-to-date background check on file, as well as a current copy of your driver's insurance.

Please save 2-liter bottles for an ecosystem project that we will be starting after the field trip.

I hope you all had an amazing Labor Day weekend. It sure made for a fast week at school having one less day. This made for a great week to review a few things in math, finish up a few group projects we had started, and grow closer to our Savior.

Here is the memory work for next week:

9/11: Hebrews 11:3, 1<sup>st</sup> Article of the Apostles Creed; 9:14: Hymn 422:1-4; 9/15: Deuteronomy 33:27, Job 12:10, Psalm 33:18a
